As Father's Day approaches, here are some gift ideas from the Model A era:

(A) The all important robe is a good idea, made of fine light-weight flannel. This double breasted style comes in brown, tan, blue or green with deep and comfortable pockets.

(B) For the Father who wants to look his best, evening scarves, either in a square style or long and narrow, of white silk brocade are very popular for the dress up events he'll attend.

(C) Gloves are always appropriate for driving. These are made of pigskin, in buff and black for those sport occasions.

(D) Leather belts are also a very appropriate Father's Day gift. These are made of sturdy leather, and look very similar to today's styles.

(E) From England come two traveling cases he'll get a lot of use from. The zippered one is made of pigskin and lined in oiled silk, perfect for his toiletries.
