Jerome Bokelmann called the meeting to order and conducted the board meeting in accordance with his duties to meet with the board in the monthly scheduled meeting.

Secretary's report: The President asked if there were any corrections or additions to the report for the November printed copy of the minutes. Donations were discussed with our Clinic location being the primary discussion point, we are not charged "rent" for the clinics however we donate for the use. A second to the motion was made by Doug Portalance in support of the motion. A vote was taken it was unanimous to make the donation.




National Club Affiliation Information
